WSH Advisory for Fatal Accidents in Second Half of 2024⁽¹⁾⁽²⁾

Twenty workplace accidents⁽³⁾ across seven incident categories are covered in this WSH Advisory for July to December 2024. To help companies learn from these accidents, this advisory highlights the risks involved and provides recommendations on how to prevent similar accidents from happening again.

¹ In 2024, there were a total of 43 fatalities from 36 accidents and 4 Work-related Traffic Accidents (WRTA).

² In 1H-24, there were 19 fatalities from 15 accidents and 3 WRTA, the Advisory for the 15 fatal accidents (excluding 3 WRTA) was earlier released on 9 October 2024: [WSH Advisory for Fatal Accidents in First Half of 2024](#)
